Subject: Computing – Autumn 1 Year: Year 5 – Search Engines

NC/PoS:

- How search engines work.
- Anyone can create a website; therefore, people should take steps to check the validity of websites.
- Web crawlers are computer programs that crawl through the internet.
- What copyright is.

Prior Learning (what pupils already know and can do)

- Understand the need to be thoughtful when working on a collaborative document.
- Use comments to suggest changes to a document and understand how to resolve comments.
- Use a variety of different slide styles to convey information, including images and transitions.
- Create a Google Form with a range of different question types that will provide different types of answers, e.g. text, multiple choice or numerical values.
- Export data to a spreadsheet, highlighting data, using conditional formatting and calculating averages and sums of numbers.

End Points (what pupils MUST know and remember)

- Explain what a search engine is, suggest several search engines to use and explain how to use them to find websites and information.
- Suggest that things online are not always true and recognise what to check for.
- Explain why keywords are important and what TASK stands for, using these strategies to search effectively.
- Recognise the terms 'copyright' and 'fair use' and combine text and images in a poster.
- Make parallels between book searching and internet searching, explaining the role of web crawlers and recognising that results are rated to decide rank.
